Panorama Survey - Teachers/Staff

Strengths:

- 96% of teachers and 100% of staff responded favorably that their work matters to them.
- 88% of teachers responded favorably that in regards to social awareness they are confident that they can support students' growth and development.

Weaknesses:

- 96% of teachers and 100% of staff responded favorably that they often feel exhausted at work.
- 65% of teachers and 53% of staff responded favorably to what extent they are trusted to work in the way they think is best.

Panorama Survey - Family

Strengths:

- 97% of families responded favorably to the question regarding to what extent drugs are a problem at your child's school indicating they are not a problem at all.
- 97% of families responded favorably to the likelihood that someone from your child's school will bully him/her online indicating that it is not very likely.

Weaknesses:

- 49% of families responded favorably to how comfortable their child is in asking for help from school adults.
- 57% of families responded favorably to how well does the overall approach to discipline work for your child.

Panorama Survey - Student SEL Surveys (Teacher's Perception)

Strengths:

- 62% of teachers responded favorably to how often their students are able to control his/her emotions when they need to.
- 62% of teachers responded favorably to how considerate their students were of his/her classmates' feelings during the past 30 days.

Weaknesses:

- 49% of teachers responded favorably to how confident their students are in their ability to learn all of the material presented in their class.
- 49% of teachers responded favorably to how focused the students are overall in their class.

2022-2023 School Wide Goals for success!

- Increase the current teacher certification rate from 72% to 77%.
- Increase teacher retention rate from 80% to 85%.
- 80% of Kindergarten students will score Basic or Above on the End of Year School-wide Science Assessment.
- Decrease the percentage of students missing more than 14 days from 43% to 38%.
- Increase the percentage of Kindergarten students scoring Basic or Above on the End of Year ELA and Math District Assessment from 88% to 90%.
- Increase the percentage of Pre-Kindergarten students scoring Average or Above on the End of Year ELA and Math District Assessment from 80% to 82%.
- Decrease the number of office referrals from <u>129 to below 100</u>.
